Skipper set to expand PVC pipe mfg capacity

The company has invested over ₹40 crore for a plant in Ahmedabad

Ahmedabad: Kolkata-headquartered Skipper Limited, a leading player in power transmission & distribution infrastructure, has invested more than Rs40 crore to set up a PVC pipe manufacturing facility at Changodar in Ahmedabad, which will become operational from Wednesday.

Devesh Bansal, the company's director, said that the Changodar plant has capacity to produce up to 10,000

metric tonne of PVC pipes per annum.

"With the commissioning of this plant, our capacity will double to 20,000 MT per annum. We aim to become a pan-India company and are setting up three more plants in Guwahati, Ghaziabad and Andhra Pradesh, which will double our capacity to 40,000 MT by the end of this year," Bansal said.

The plant at Changodar, which would be inaugurated by water supply minister Vijay Rupani, was completed in just about 100 days, said Bansal.

The BSE-listed Skipper Limited has a market cap of Rs1,750 crore. Bansal said that the shares would be listed on NSE soon.
